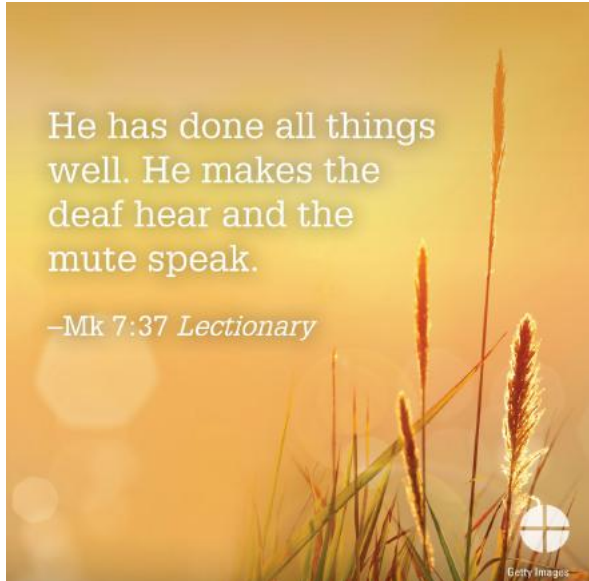

Reflection

Today, we look at the last of the three-phase revolutionary change that Jesus brought about in the Jewish world of his time, which invariably became the bedrock of the Jesus movement that culminated in Christianity. The first two being theological renewal and diffusing the cultural tension of externalism which in our time we likened to the tension between individualism versus corporate destiny, between materialism versus stewardship and between entertainment culture versus contemplative search for God (faith). That last phase is social inequality.

From time immemorial, the world seems to have been divided into the haves and the have nots; the oppressed and the oppressors; the fortunate and the unfortunate; etc. and maybe some at the center who define these lines: "For if a man with gold rings... comes into your assembly, and a poor person... also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing the fine clothes... while you say to the poor one, "stand there", ...have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?" (2nd reading)

Incidentally, it is not only poverty that keeps one at the low end of the social ladder. Sickness (deaf, dumb, cancer, etc.), disabilities and inabilities are all factors that define the social structure and one thing that is common among those at this unpleasant side of the society is fear as they grapple with uncertainties of life. But today, there is hope: "Thus says the Lord: 'Say to those whose hearts are frightened: 'Be strong, fear not! Here is your God...'" (1st reading)

This God of ours is a God that saves: "And people brought to him a deaf man who had a speech impediment... He took him... away from the crowd... and said to him... 'Ephphatha!'" (Gospel) The people's verdict after this miracle is very interesting. "He has done all things well..." Something needs to be done well in your life today. If you are a judge without evil designs, (2nd reading) you will agree that no matter who you are, you have a need in your life and so has the other person. These needs may not be the same, but they are all needs and so there should be no lines demarcating one from the other. Instead, let us join hands with Jesus to do all things well so that our society will be one where everyone lives without fear because there is equality, justice, and love.

"And people brought him a deaf man who had speech impediment..." at the same time indicate that God expects us to lend a helping hand to those in need. Our strength should not be used to pull others down or hold them down but to lift them up. Who can I lift up today? Who can I bring to the Lord today?
